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1	CONSTITUTION		
2 3 4	ARTICLE I  This organization, incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois in the United States of America, shall be known as Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity.		
5 6 7 8	ARTICLE II  The object of this Fraternity shall be to keep high the standards of dentistry by inculcating in the minds of dental students and practitioners a spirit of fraternal cooperation toward scientific, ethical and professional progress.		
9 10 11	This Fraternity is organized and operated to promote the common business interest of dentists and is not organized for profit. No part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholders or individuals.		
12 13	ARTICLE III Section 1. No person shall be eligible for admission to this Fraternity who is not:		
14 15	A. a dental student working toward the American degree of D.D.S., D.M.D. or its equivalent.		
16	B. a practitioner of dentistry.		
17	C. one who has made notable contributions to dentistry or to the Fraternity.		
18 19	The aforementioned qualifications notwithstanding, no person shall be barred from membership on the basis of race, color, gender, religion, or national origin.		
20 21	Section 2. The headquarters of the fraternity shall be located in the United States of America, at such place as the Supreme Council shall determine.		
22 23 24	Section 3. This Fraternity shall be international in scope. The following organizations shall be its governing bodies constituted and having the jurisdiction, right duties, and privileges as hereinafter prescribed:

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# 32 ARTICLE IV

# The Supreme Chapter

Section 1. The Supreme Chapter shall be the governing body of the Fraternity and will establish all policy. However, such matters that are by Constitution may be delegated to the Supreme Council and/or to any component of the Supreme Chapter.

Section 2. Membership in the Supreme Chapter of Delta Sigma Delta shall be of two kinds: active Supreme Chapter membership and honorary membership. Each active Supreme Chapter member at the time of admission into the Supreme Chapter, through a Graduate Chapter, shall be or have been a licensed practitioner of dentistry, or shall be a graduate member of an Undergraduate Chapter. Honorary membership shall be granted by election of individuals who have made notable contributions to the profession of dentistry, to Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity, or to society in general.

Section 3. Active members of the Supreme Chapter shall be those that have paid the stipulated life membership fee. They shall have the right to cast ballot and hold office.

Section 4. The officers of the Supreme Chapter shall be a Supreme Grand Master, Supreme Worthy Master, Past Supreme Grand Master, Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer, Supreme Historian, Supreme Senior Page, Supreme Junior Page, and Supreme Tyler. All officers excepting the Past Supreme Grand Master, Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer and the Supreme Historian shall be elected by a majority vote at a called meeting of the Supreme Chapter. The Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer and the Supreme Historian shall be elected by the Supreme Chapter only after recommendation by the Supreme Council for such term of office as the Supreme Council may designate, not to exceed five (5) years. Names of intended nominees from the floor for these three offices must be presented with credentials for discussion at the Supreme Council meeting prior to the election. The other elective officers to serve one (1) year or until their successors are elected and installed. All officers may be reelected at the pleasure of the Supreme Chapter. The Supreme Worthy Master shall, at the expiration of the term of office, automatically assume the office of Supreme Grand Master. Each officer shall hold office until his successor has been chosen and installed. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office.

Section 5. The immediate Past Supreme Grand Master shall be the retiring Supreme Grand Master and shall serve as a member of the Supreme Council. If he or she

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declines to serve or accepts another elective office, the office of the Immediate Past Supreme Grand Master shall revert to the preceding Past Supreme Grand Master most recently in office.

Section 6. One Deputy Supreme Grand Master shall be appointed annually by the Supreme Grand Master to each Undergraduate Chapter with the advice and approval of the Supreme Council. Such Assistant Deputy Supreme Grand Masters may be appointed as deemed desirable. It shall be the duty of the Deputy Supreme Grand Master to supervise and approve the submission of an annual report and roster of the undergraduate chapter, the annual life membership fees, the per capita fees, and the initiation fees to the Supreme Scribe. These reports will be submitted on forms approved by Supreme Council and furnished by the Supreme Scribe.

Section 7. One Representative of the Supreme Grand Master shall be appointed annually by the Supreme Grand Master to each Graduate Chapter, except in Europe where there shall be only one representing the European Continental Chapter. The Representative shall be appointed annually by the Supreme Grand Master with the advice and approval of the Supreme Council. Such Alternate Representatives to the Supreme Grand Master may be appointed as deemed desirable. It shall be the duty of the Representative of the Supreme Grand Master to supervise the submission of a yearly report and roster of the Graduate Chapter and the annual per capita fee to the Supreme Scribe, these reports to be on a form approved by the Supreme Council and furnished by the Supreme Scribe.

Section 8. The Supreme Chapter shall hold at least one meeting every two years unless prevented by a grave national emergency. The time and place of such a called meeting shall be determined by the Supreme Council and the Supreme Chapter. Only active members of the Supreme Chapter and invited guests of the Supreme Council may attend those meetings.

Section 9. A quorum for the transaction of business at meetings of the Supreme Chapter shall be not less than twenty-five members in good standing.

Section 10. The election and installation of Supreme Chapter officers shall take place at a called meeting. All officers of the Supreme Chapter except the Supreme Grand Master and Past Supreme Grand Master shall be elected by a majority vote of the members present and voting at a called meeting. If a vacancy should occur in the office of Supreme Grand Master, the Supreme Worthy Master shall immediately assume that office. All other vacancies shall be filled by the Supreme Council. Eligibility for election shall require attendance at two out of three of the last called meetings, counting the meeting at which the election is held as one of the three. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office.

Section 11. Within the limitations herein prescribed qualifications for membership 102 in the Supreme Chapter, initiation requirements and ritual, the amount of fees payable 103 therefore, the allocation thereof and methods of procedure affecting all such matters, 104 shall be prescribed by bylaws of the Supreme Chapter. 105 ARTICLE V 106 The Supreme Council 107 Section 1. The Fraternity shall have a Supreme Council composed of the following 108 officers: Supreme Grand Master, Supreme Worthy Master, Supreme Scribe, Supreme 109 Treasurer, Supreme Historian, and Immediate Past Supreme Grand Master. 110 In addition to the afore mentioned Officers, the Supreme Council shall include the 111 following members: 112 A. Two representatives from the Council of Deputies not to exceed two years 113 each. 114 B. Two representatives from the Council of Graduate Chapters not to exceed 115 two years each. 116 C. The Representative of the European Continental Chapter. 117 D. The Coordinator of the Graduate Chapters of Australia and New Zealand. 118 E.. The Chairman of the Life Membership Fund Trustees. 119 Section 2. The Supreme Council shall act as executive body on all matters relating 120 to the Fraternity unless otherwise provided in the Constitution, and shall implement 121 policies established by the Supreme Chapter. The Supreme Council shall report all 122 actions to the Supreme Chapter at the called meeting. 123 Section 3. Should a vacancy occur in the office of Supreme Grand Master the title 124 and duties of this office shall be assumed by the Immediate Past Supreme Grand Master. 125 Vacancies in other elective offices shall be filled by the Supreme Council. The Supreme 126 Grand Master shall fill all vacancies that may occur in committees by appointment. 127 Section 4. The Supreme Grand Master shall have the power to call meetings of the 128 Supreme Council directing the Supreme Scribe to notify all members of the same. Upon 129 written request of five or more Supreme Council members it is mandatory that such a 130 meeting shall be called. Five or more members shall constitute a quorum at any Supreme 131 Council meeting. The Supreme Grand Master shall vote only in case of a tie.

Section 5. The Supreme Council may grant Charters to Graduate, Undergraduate

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suspended or revoked by the Supreme Council for cause. These actions to be reviewed by the Supreme Chapter at the Annual Called Meeting.

Section 6. An annual per capita fee shall be paid by graduate and undergraduate members to the Supreme Chapter. The per capita fee shall be determined annually by the Supreme Council and an increase in said fee shall not exceed 50% in any one year.

ARTICLE VI

# **Graduate Chapters**

Section 1. Graduate Chapters of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity shall be organized bodies of active members of the Supreme Chapter.

- Section 2. Charters of the organization of Graduate Chapters may be granted on petition to the Supreme Council by a group of active members of the Supreme Chapter who are residents of, or are practicing their profession in a city, county or state. Charters for chapters in the continent of Europe and the British Isles shall be recommended by the European Continental Chapter and may be granted on petition to the Supreme Council.
- Section 3. A Graduate Chapter shall receive its name and charter from the Supreme Council. A fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be paid for such charter.
- Section 4. The Constitution and Bylaws and the Ritual of the Supreme Chapter shall be fundamental in the organization and control of all Graduate Chapters.
- Section 5. Within the limitations herein prescribed, qualifications for membership in any Graduate Chapter, regulations and ritual governing the election and initiation of members, and methods of procedure affecting such matters shall be prescribed by Bylaws of the Supreme Chapter.

Section 6. The officers of a Graduate Chapter shall be: Grand Master, Worthy Master, Scribe, Treasurer, Historian, Senior Page, Junior Page and Tyler. The Grand Master, Worthy Master, Senior Page, Junior Page and Tyler shall be elected by the membership. All other officers shall be appointed by a committee of the Grand Master, Worthy Master and retiring Grand Master (who shall be known as the Past Grand Master). All officers of Graduate Chapters shall serve terms of one year or until their successors are installed, except the Scribe and Historian, who shall serve for three years. In areas other than the contiguous states of the U.S.A., Graduate Chapters may choose additional officers as are deemed necessary. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office.

**ARTICLE VII** 168 **Undergraduate Chapters** 169 Section 1. Undergraduate Chapters of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity shall be 170 organized bodies of undergraduate members in dental schools. Undergraduate students in 171 dental schools shall be defined as those working toward the American degree of D.D.S. or 172 D.M.D. or its equivalent. 173 Section 2. Undergraduate Chapters shall be composed of undergraduate students in 174 schools and colleges of dentistry and may be chartered by action of the Supreme Council 175 or Supreme Chapter upon petition of five or more members of the Supreme Chapter. In 176 localities other than the contiguous states of the U.S.A., approval of the petition must be 177 given by the Continental and/or Graduate Chapter having jurisdiction before favorable 178 action can be taken by the Supreme Council or Supreme Chapter. Should no such 179 Continental Chapter exist, approval or disapproval of the petition shall rest solely with the 180 Supreme Council or Supreme Chapter. The minimum number of chapter members shall 181 be eight. 182 Section 3. Any five members of the Fraternity in good standing may constitute a 183 committee to petition the Supreme Council for permission to establish an Undergraduate 184 Chapter in any reputable dental school. The Supreme Council may deputize this 185 committee to carry out the organization. This committee shall cooperate with and be 186 governed by adopted rules of the American Dental Interfraternity Council. 187 Section 4. The petition shall have the following information: 188 A. Number and names of secret societies already in the institution. 189 B. Number of students in attendance. 190 C. Number of students in dental fraternities. 191 D. Number and names of dental fraternities having houses on campus. 192 Ε. A catalogue or curriculum of the institution. 193 F. A charter fee of \$50.00. 194

All information shall be reviewed by the Supreme Council before granting a charter.

After the Supreme Council or Supreme Chapter has granted a charter to the eight or more charter members, these shall be regularly proposed and initiated according to the Constitution and ritual by the local organizing committee or by a chartered chapter deputized by the Supreme Grand Master.

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Section 3. The officers of the Council of Deputies shall be President, President-elect, Secretary-Treasurer and the Director of Annual Regional Meetings. The President-elect shall be elected by majority vote at each meeting of the Council of Deputies and shall succeed to the office of President at the next following meeting. The Secretary-Treasurer and Director of Annual Regional Meetings shall be elected to serve for a term of three years. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office. These officers shall be elected by majority vote at the Called Meeting of the Council of Deputies and shall hold office for one year or until their successors have been elected and installed.

Section 4. In the event of inability of the President to serve, the President-elect shall assume the office of President.

Section 5. Regional meetings of Undergraduate Chapters shall be held annually except in case of national emergency. These regional meetings shall be held under the jurisdiction of the Council of Deputies.

Section 6. The Council of Deputies shall elect two members of the Council of Deputies to be known as the Council Members from the Council of Deputies to serve on the Supreme Council for a term of three years. A ballot shall be used whenever two or more members are candidates for one position.

Section 7. The Council of Deputies shall elect a Representative to the Budget Committee at each Annual Meeting to serve a period of one (1) year. The member may serve additional terms if reelected by the Council of Deputies.

248 ARTICLE IX

# **Council of Graduate Chapters**

Section 1. The active membership in the Council of Graduate Chapters shall be composed of one Representative from each of the several Graduate Chapters. It shall be the duty of the Supreme Council to establish, from time to time, the rules applicable to such membership. Where Continental Chapters exist, they shall have the sole right to nominate to the Supreme Grand Master and Supreme Council one Representative to the Council of Graduate Chapters and the Supreme Council. One Alternate Representative may be nominated to serve in the absence of the Representative. The several chapters in Australia and New Zealand shall have the sole right to nominate to the Supreme Grand Master and Supreme Council one Representative to the Council of Graduate Chapters and the Supreme Council. One Alternate Representative may be nominated to serve in the absence of the Representative.

Its object shall be to discuss the problems of the Graduate Chapters, to widen the scope of activities of the Graduate Chapters and contribute to the interest and progress of the Fraternity.

- Section 2. The Council of Graduate Chapters shall hold a meeting in conjunction with a Called Meeting of the Supreme Chapter except in case of a national emergency.
- Section 3. The officers of the Council of Graduate Chapters shall be President, President-elect and Secretary-Treasurer. They shall be elected by a majority vote at a Called Meeting of the Council of Graduate Chapters and shall hold office until their Successors are elected and installed. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office.
- Section 4. The Council of Graduate Chapters shall elect two members to the Supreme Council to be known as the Council Members from the Council of Graduate Chapters, to serve for a term of three years. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same office.
- Section 5. The Council of Graduate Chapters shall elect a Representative to the Budget Committee at each annual meeting to serve a period of one (1) year. The member may serve additional terms if reelected by the Council of Graduate Chapters.
- Section 6. An annual per capita fee is to be determined by the Supreme Council. Fees shall be paid for each member by each Graduate Chapter. The European Continental Chapter Treasurer shall pay the per capita fee for each of its members. Graduate Chapter membership reports (Scribe's Reports) as of December 31 shall be submitted to the Supreme Scribe by February 15 of each year. Payment of the per capita fee for each member shall accompany the report.
- Section 7. Individual Graduate Chapters may establish criteria based on length of membership, age of individuals and/or service to their chapter which would exempt them from the payment of dues and/or per capita to their chapter. This will not, however, exempt the chapter from payment of an annual per capita fee on their behalf to the Supreme Scribe by February 15 of each year.

# Section 8. It shall be mandatory:

- A. That each Graduate Chapter member of the Council of Graduate Chapters establish its fiscal year as January 1 to December 31.
  - B. That each chapter shall bill its members for dues including per capita fee as of January 1st of each year.
  - C. That Graduate Chapter members failing to pay their dues in the Graduate Chapter by December 31st shall automatically be dropped from Graduate Chapter membership, unless the chapter elects to pay the per capita for them.
- D. The Treasurer of the European Continental Chapter shall submit the annual per capita fee for each of its active members as described in Section 6.

Ε. Each Treasurer of the Australian and New Zealand Chapters shall submit 299 the annual per capita fee for each of its active members as described in 300 Section 6. 301 ARTICLE X 302 **Continental Chapters** 303 Section 1. Continental Chapters shall be the governing bodies of Delta Sigma Delta 304 Fraternity activities outside of the United States of America where two or more Graduate 305 Chapters are chartered. Continental Chapters shall be subject to the Supreme Chapter. 306 Section 2. Each Continental Chapter member at the time of admission, either 307 directly or through a Graduate Chapter, shall be a licensed practitioner of dentistry, 308 actively engaged in the practice of dentistry or some other closely allied branch of dental 309 health service. 310 Section 3. The officers of a Continental Chapter shall be elected by the members of 311 that Chapter. A secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates 312 for the same office. 313 Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Continental Chapters to foster and uphold the principles of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity as exemplified by the Supreme Chapter Ritual. 315 Section 5. The European Continental Chapter shall have jurisdiction over the 316 British Isles and the Continent of Europe. 317 318 Section 6. The officers of the European Continental Chapter shall be a Grand 319 Master, Worthy Master, Scribe and Treasurer, to be elected annually by that Chapter. A 320 secret ballot shall be held whenever two or more members are candidates for the same 321 office. Such other officers as are required for exemplification of the ritual or for other 322 functions shall be appointed by the Grand Master. 323 Section 7. The regular meeting of the European Continental Chapter shall be held at 324 least once each year at such time and place as the Council may designate, at least thirty 325 days notice being given by the Scribe, when the time and place have been agreed upon at 326 an Annual Meeting, if circumstances necessitates, these may be changed by the 327 unanimous vote of the Council. 328 Section 8. The Chapter shall have the power to elect and initiate into the Supreme 329 Chapter, members of the dental profession residing outside the jurisdiction of Graduate 330

Chapters within its jurisdiction, subject to the approval of the Supreme Council.

332	Section 9. The Chapter shall investigate and recommend the organization and
333	chartering of Graduate and Undergraduate Chapters within its jurisdiction, subject to the
334	approval of the Supreme Council.
335	Section 10. The Chapter shall designate such committees as it deems necessary.
336	Section 11. It shall be the duty of the Grand Master to preside at all meetings,
337	appoint all committees, sign all orders drawn on the Treasurer, attested by the Scribe, in
338	payment of all expenses pertaining to the proper functioning of the Chapter, to have a
339	deciding vote in case of a tie, and to have a general supervision of all Delta Sigma Delta
340	Fraternity activities in the jurisdiction of the Chapter.
341	Section 12. All monies payable to the Supreme Chapter from any fraternal source in
342	Europe shall be remitted through the Treasurer of the European Continental Chapter. In
343	like manner, all communications from the Supreme Scribe, dealing with financial
344	considerations relating to any fraternal source in Europe shall be sent through the
345	Treasurer of the European Continental Chapter.
346	Section 13. The Chapter shall abide by the Bylaws of the Supreme Chapter that are
347	applicable to it; the Chapter may, however, adopt such other Bylaws as may be found
348	necessary for its needs provided such Bylaws shall be approved by the Supreme Council.
349	Section 14. Charters for Graduate and Undergraduate Chapters located in countries
350	or continents other than North America shall bear the signatures of the Supreme Grand
351	Master, the Supreme Scribe, and also the Grand Master and Scribe of the Continental
352	Chapter in whose jurisdiction the new Chapter is located.
353	Section 15. Continental Chapters may be suspended or annulled in accordance with
354	Article V, Section 5, of this Constitution.
355	ARTICLE XI
356	Fraternity Funds
357	Section 1. The funds of the Supreme Chapter shall be derived from life membership
358	fees, monies received from endowments or any other source, together with revenue
359	accruing thereon, and revenue from the resale of supplies, books and jewelry.
360	General Fund
361	Section 2. The general fund shall consist of the following: such percentage of all

Section 2. The general fund shall consist of the following: such percentage of all life membership fees as shall be designated by the Supreme Council; annual dues of Undergraduates; per capita fees from Graduate Chapters; funds from resale of supplies, books, jewelry and from any other source. The Supreme Scribe shall collect all funds and deposit them in a bank selected by the Supreme Council.

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# Life Membership Trust Fund

Section 3. The Life Membership Trust Fund shall consist of such percentage of all life membership fees as shall be designated by the Supreme Council. Such portions of life membership fees as allocated according to the Constitution and Bylaws shall be remitted and deposited by the Supreme Scribe in a bank, trust or investment company chosen by the Supreme Council; said bank, trust or investment company shall be the official custodian of the fund. Funds from the investment portfolio of the Life Membership Fund may be distributed for current operations at an annual level not to exceed five (5) percent of the market value of the Fraternity's portfolio assets for the prior three year period calculated on a quarterly basis. The percentage will be set annually by the Supreme Council.

Section 4. The bank, trust or investment company shall on written order of the Life Membership Fund trustees invest the Life Membership Fund in high grade securities. The bank, trust or investment company shall remit not less than four times a year a draft covering funds to the Supreme Scribe. The Supreme Scribe on receipt of such draft shall credit the amount, endorse the draft and deposit it in the general fund.

Section 5. The Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer, Chairman of the Life Membership Fund trustees and administrative assistant shall give bond in such amount, with such surety, and in such form as shall be approved by the Supreme Council. The cost of all such bonds shall be paid by the Supreme Chapter.

Section 6. In the event that destiny decrees the dissolution of the Supreme Chapter of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity, all monies and property belonging to this chapter at the time of dissolution shall be duly and legally given to the Educational Foundation of Delta Sigma Delta.

Section 9. The COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS shall consist of six members. Two of whom shall be the Scribe of the European Continental Chapter and the Australia/New Zealand Coordinator. The duties of this committee shall be to make a careful study of the Constitution and Bylaws and consider whatever changes are necessary to conform with progress and changing conditions of the Fraternity. This committee shall present a report at a Called Meeting of the Supreme Chapter.

Section 10. The AWARDS COMMITTEE shall consist of seven (7) members composed of the five (5) Past Supreme Grand Masters plus one member representing the European Continental Chapter and one member representing the Australian and New Zealand Chapters. The Committee shall be chaired by the Immediate Past Supreme Grand Master. In the event the Immediate Past Supreme Grand Master is unable to serve, the most recent surviving Past Supreme Grand Master shall assume that office and the most recent Past Supreme Grand Master to have served on the committee shall be summoned to fill the vacancy thus created..

The duties of this Committee shall be to prepare and submit a list of nominees for the various awards and/or nominations for Honorary membership to the Supreme Scribe, who shall forward these nominations to the Supreme Council along with appropriate letters of recommendation and/or curriculum vitae for each nominee. This list shall be in the hands of the Supreme Scribe at least thirty (30) days prior to the Ad Interim meeting of the Supreme Council. The Chair of the Awards Committee shall poll the members of this committee on all nominees and the results of this polling shall be the name(s) submitted to the Supreme Scribe.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD. Meritorious Service Award nominees shall be those individual members who have made outstanding contributions to Delta Sigma Delta and the dental profession. It shall be the highest award of the Fraternity. More than one award may be granted in any one year at the discretion of and direction of the Supreme Council.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE DECREE AWARD. Nominees shall be individual members that have contributed to Delta Sigma Delta in a notable way. More than one award may be granted in any one year st the discretion of and direction of the Supreme Council. The nominees for Distinguished Service Decree Award may or may not include recipients of other awards.

ACHIEVEMENT AWARD. Nominees shall be individuals, not necessarily members of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity or the dental profession, who have made exemplary contributions to the profession and/or humanity. More than one award may be granted in any one year at the discretion of and direction of the Supreme Council.

The Committee may consider individuals for HONORARY MEMBERSHIP.

Nominations for any of the awards may be made to the Awards Committee by any member of the Supreme Chapter in good standing at least sixty (60) days prior to the Ad Interim Meeting of the Supreme Council. However, any nomination must be sanctioned by the customs, rules, regulations and protocols of the nominee's parent chapter prior to being presented to the Awards Committee.

Section 11. The SURVEY COMMITTEE shall be composed of no less than five (5) or more than seven (7) members. Members will serve a minimum of one two-year term, with a maximum of three (3) terms. Terms will be staggered so that no more than two members will be replaced at any one time. It shall be the duty of this committee to continuously monitor the membership and activities of all chapters of the Fraternity (Supreme, Graduate, and Undergraduate) suggesting changes deemed in the best interest of the organization, advising Representatives and Deputies on problems affecting their chapters, and initiating corrective action when necessary, including personal visitation by one or more committee members or their appointed representatives. All such actions will include appropriate follow-up evaluation. The committee will present an annual report to the Supreme Council and ad interim reports when corrective actions have been initiated.

Section 12. The COMMITTEE FOR THE OBSERVATION OF RITUAL, EQUIPMENT, AND CARE OF PARAPHERNALIA shall consist of a Chairman, the Senior and Junior Pages, the Supreme Scribe, the Supreme Historian, Representatives from the ECC and the Australasian Chapters, and at least two other members one of whom shall be the GUARDIAN OF HISTORICAL ARCHIVES COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN who shall be responsible for securing and maintaining the historical artifacts of this Fraternity. The charge of this committee shall be to care for the ritual paraphernalia; to set up the paraphernalia for meetings and afterward to pack the paraphernalia for shipment to the designated storage site; to observe the conduct of the meeting ritual to ensure accurate performance; and to advise the Supreme Council regarding the care and use of paraphernalia and the performance of the ritual at the Supreme Chapter meeting.

Section 13. The chairman of the FRATERNITY WEB SITE COMMITTEE shall be appointed by the Supreme Council and shall coordinate information disseminated on the web site with the publication of DESMOS so that the web site is regularly updated and remains current. The duties of this committee are to make suggestions for development of our web site, to monitor the functionality of the web site, to report on web site progress including any new recommendations twice a year to the Supreme Council before the Ad

Engraving and finish--One Delta shall be polished plain, with a fine line cut around 554 the inner and outer edges, the other to be appropriately engraved. 555 Settings--The Sigma shall be set with one Bohemian garnet at each corner and one 556 in the central angle, making five (5) in all. The upper diagonal bar shall be set with 557 two turquoises, and the lower horizontal bar with four (4) turquoises, making six (6) 558 in all. Material--The material from which the insignia is to be made shall be 10K gold or 560 material deemed appropriate by the Supreme Council. 561 To distinguish the Supreme from the Undergraduate Chapter insignia, a crown, set 562 with a diamond or similar jewel one-eighth (1/8) carat in weight, shall be added to the pin. 563 The insignia of all Past Supreme Grand Masters shall have added to the Supreme Chapter 564 pin a crescent of gold extending from the sides of the crown, around the lower part of the 565 pin and attached to the six points of the "Deltas" and bearing the letters P.S.G.M. 566 separated alternately by garnet and turquoise enamel. The Past Grand Masters of Continental Chapters shall be similar in all respects to that of the Past Supreme Grand 568 Masters, except that the crescent shall be replaced by a band of ribbon. 569 The insignia for Honorary members shall be similar in all respects to that of the Past 570 Supreme Grand Masters, except that the crescent shall be replaced by a wreath of laurel. 571 Section 2. The insignia shall be manufactured under the supervision of the Supreme 572 Council and shall be obtained from the Supreme Scribe only, except on continents other 573 than North America, where Chapters may have insignias manufactured locally, but must 574 conform to the Supreme Chapter specifications. Undergraduate Chapters insignia may be 575 crown set if desired. 576 Section 3. The insignia shall be the property of the Fraternity and may be worn by a 577 member only when he is in good standing in the Fraternity. Members not in good standing 578 and those who are suspended or expelled must, on the demand of the Supreme Scribe, 579 surrender the insignia. 580 Section 4. The Fraternity shall have for its colors turquoise-blue and garnet. 581 Section 5. The Fraternity shall have for its flower the dark-red or garnet carnation. 582 ARTICLE XV 583 Seal, Coat of Arms, and Banner 584 Section 1. The seal of this Fraternity shall be in the form of a circle with a 585

monogram of the three Greek letters, Delta, Sigma, Delta, surrounded by the words

"Supreme Chapter".

Section 2. The seal shall be in the charge of the Supreme Scribe.

Section 3. The coat of arms of this Fraternity shall be described with the heraldic blazon: Azure, five lucernae flamed all or on a chevron of gules, between in dexter chief crossed keys webbed downward and in sinister chief an all-seeing eye resplendent all of the third. In the base an open argent debruised by a skull affronte over two femur bones crossed saltirewise all of the third. The crest shall be a royal crown or bearing the three Greek Letters, Delta Sigma Delta, on a wreath of colors and ribbon gules. The motto shall be a scroll of the name, Delta Sigma Delta.

The interpreted blazon describes a shield of blue with five (5) lamps of gold on a red chevron. In upper left-hand corner, crossed gold keys and in top right-hand corner, the all-seeing eye. In base a skull front view over crossed bones resting on an open book. In the crest a royal crown with the three (3) letters, Delta Sigma Delta, on a torse and with ribbons of red. Motto Delta Sigma Delta on a scroll.

Section 4. The banner of the Supreme Chapter shall include the colors of the Fraternity-red and blue-and shall bear the insignia of the Supreme Chapter. The field of the banner may be red and the insignia, lettering and embellishment of blue, a reverse use of the colors may be employed or the lettering in the insignia may be of gold, but no colors except red and blue with gold shall be used.

Section 5. Banners for Continental and Graduate Chapters shall be similarly constructed.

Section 6. Banners or pennants of Undergraduate Chapters shall use Greek Letters and location only.

Section 7. Pennants shall be triangular in shape, with a length of forty-five (45) inches and width of nineteen (19) inches or in this proportion, with turquoise-blue field and garnet border (or vice versa) two inches wide, or in this proportion, and may carry either the Greek Letters, Delta Sigma Delta, or the monogram insignia of the Supreme Chapter, or of the Undergraduate Chapters, in accordance with the use to be made of such pennant.

ARTICLE XVI

Password Password

This fraternity shall have a password, chosen annually by the Supreme Grand Master and notification shall be sent by the Supreme Scribe to all Graduate and Undergraduate Chapters and Scribes of Continental Chapters as soon as practical after its adoption.

ARTICLE XVII

# 622 Amendments

Any of the provisions of these Constitutions and Bylaws may be altered, modified or annulled by amendment. The exclusive power to make such amendments shall be vested in the Supreme Chapter. Every proposed amendment, or an abbreviated form of the proposed amendment showing the purpose and intent of the proposal shall be submitted in writing to the Supreme Chapter at a regular Called Meeting, or to the Supreme Scribe on or before May 1st the following year. All such proposed amendments shall be published and circulated to the membership at least 30 days prior to the next regularly Called Meeting of the Supreme Chapter. A vote on all proposals shall be taken at said meeting following publication.

Adoption shall be a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the members present and voting. Amendments approved shall take effect at once, unless a specified time is included in the amendment.

ARTICLE XVIII

# **Principles of Ethics**

Section 1. The Principles of Ethics adopted by the American Dental Association, as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated herein by this reference as applicable to all members of this Fraternity.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of every member of this Fraternity to observe, in all relations with patients and fellow members of this Fraternity, the spirit of the "Golden Rule".

#### BYLAWS OF THE SUPREME CHAPTER

2 CHAPTER I

Membership

Section 1. Any member of the dental profession may be proposed in writing for membership in this Fraternity by two members in good standing at any regular or called meeting of a Graduate Chapter or Continental Chapter within the geographic section in which the candidate resides. This candidate must have resigned membership in any other dental fraternity prior to being eligible for consideration.

Section 2. The candidates name shall at once be referred by the Grand Master to an investigating committee of three active members who shall carefully investigate the character and reputation of the candidate and shall in due time report to the Chapter. When the candidate does not reside within the jurisdiction of a Graduate Chapter or Continental Chapter the report shall be made to the Supreme Council, through the Supreme Scribe.

Section 3. When a favorable report has been submitted by not less than two members of the investigating committee, a secret ballot shall be taken at any regular or called meeting of the Chapter at which the name was proposed, thirty days or more after the proposal of the name, provided a written notice was sent to the members of the Chapter at least ten days prior to such meeting. Said notice shall designate the time and place of meeting and the name of the candidate to be voted upon. Any candidate receiving more than two negative votes shall not again be proposed for membership before the second Annual Meeting of the Graduate Chapter after the rejection.

Section 4. If not more than two negative votes are cast, the candidate may become a member of the Supreme Chapter, by initiation, at that or at any regular called meeting of the Graduate Chapter held within the subsequent years. If at the end of two years following election the candidate has not presented himself for initiation, the name shall be erased from the list of those eligible for initiation unless an extension of time is granted by a majority vote of the Chapter. Any member proposing the name of a candidate for membership may withdraw the proposal at any time before balloting on that candidate has begun. A joint ballot shall not be construed as a ballot on any one candidate.

Section 5. When a candidate does not reside within the jurisdiction of a Graduate Chapter the name shall be proposed in accordance with Section 1 and 2 of this Article, to the Supreme Council or the Continental Chapter if residing outside of the United States of America, together with a written statement from those proposing the name, citing valid reasons why the candidate is deemed worthy of membership in this Fraternity. The unanimous vote of the Supreme Council or Continental Chapter shall be necessary to elect such a candidate to membership in the Supreme Chapter.

**CHAPTER II** 1 Initiation 2 Section 1. Candidates who have been elected may become active members of the 3 Supreme Chapter through initiation. At the initiation the Ritual prescribed by the 4 Supreme Chapter shall be followed. 5 Section 2. Before initiation, each candidate shall pay the required fee and shall take 6 an oath never to reveal any of the secrets of the Fraternity except to one lawfully entitled to them. Immediately after the initiation the member shall sign the Constitution and 8 Bylaws and shall agree to abide by their provisions and shall acknowledge in writing the 9 control of the Supreme Chapter over the Fraternity's property. 10 Section 3. Candidates who do not reside within the jurisdiction of a Graduate 11 Chapter may be initiated into the Fraternity at a called meeting of the Supreme Chapter; 12 or the Supreme Council or Continental Chapter may delegate such initiation to the 13 Graduate Chapter most convenient to the candidate. 14 Section 4. The Supreme Chapter or Continental Chapter may initiate candidates 15 living within the jurisdiction of a Graduate Chapter upon the written permission of the 16 officers of such Graduate Chapter. 17 Section 5. With the exception made in Section 4 of this article duly elected 18 candidates living within the jurisdiction of a Continental Chapter shall be initiated by a 19 Graduate Chapter within the jurisdiction of the Continental Chapter. 20 Section 6. After initiation the Scribe of the officiating Chapter shall at once report 21 to the Supreme Scribe and remit to the Supreme Chapter the initiation fee. 22 Section 7. Graduate members of Undergraduate Chapters may become members of 23 the Supreme Chapter by taking the obligation provided for them in the Supreme Chapter 24 Ritual and paying the required fee hereinafter provided. 25 **CHAPTER III** 26 **Honorary Membership** 27 Section 1. Any person, who after being duly proposed for Honorary membership as 2.8 described in ARTICLE IV, Section 2 of the Constitution of the Supreme Chapter, and 29 having received the unanimous vote of all members present and voting at a Called 30 Meeting of the Supreme Chapter, shall be termed as Honorary member. 31

Section 2. An Honorary member shall be exempt from payment of dues and shall be ineligible to vote or hold office.

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1 CHAPTER IV

# Reinstatement to Membership

Section 1. A former active member of the Supreme Chapter who resigned while in good standing may, upon petition, be reinstated at any regular or called meeting of a Graduate Chapter in the jurisdiction of which the member resides, provided a majority vote of the members present is received.

Section 2. A former active member of the Supreme Chapter whose membership has been forfeited by nonpayment of dues may, upon petition, be reinstated at any regular or called meeting of a Graduate Chapter in the jurisdiction of which the member resides provided a majority vote of the members present is received. Former members of the Supreme Chapter who do not reside within the jurisdiction of a Graduate Chapter shall make application for reinstatement to the Supreme Council, and upon receiving its unanimous endorsement shall be reinstated. In either instance the payment of the life membership fee must accompany the petition.

15 CHAPTER V

Duties of Officers

Section 1. The SUPREME GRAND MASTER shall have the following *duties*:

- A. To preside over the meetings of the Supreme Chapter and Supreme Council.
  - B. To have a deciding vote on all questions in case of a tie.

  - D. To authorize the Supreme Scribe to call meetings of the Chapter.

    - F. To visit in person at least one-third of the Undergraduate Chapters during his term of office; also to visit as many Graduate Chapters and Regional meetings as possible.

- Section 7. The SUPREME SENIOR PAGE shall have the following *duties*:
- A. To distribute and collect ballots.
- B. To prepare and escort candidates.

- D. To act as messenger for the Supreme Grand Master.
- Section 8. The SUPREME JUNIOR PAGE shall have the following *duties:*
- A. To assist the Supreme Senior Page
- B. To act as messenger for the Supreme Worthy Master.
- Section 9. The SUPREME TYLER shall have the following *duties*:
- A. To have charge of the door and to guard against intruders.
- B. To announce the arrival of persons and to admit them only when directed to do so by the Supreme Grand Master or Supreme Worthy Master.

1 CHAPTER VI

# 2 Fees and Dues

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Section 1. The life membership fee for each member of an Undergraduate Chapter when entering the Supreme Chapter upon graduation shall be a fee established by the Supreme Council. Each year in January, following graduation, the payment of an annual per capita fee will reaffirm the member's support of the good works of the fraternity and continue the subscription to all issues of the official publication, DESMOS. Graduate members, residing at home or abroad, paying an annual per capita fee through a Graduate Chapter will not be additionally responsible for an annual per capita fee.

Section 2. The initiation fee of each member entering from the profession shall be determined by the Supreme Council. This fee will establish life membership in Delta Sigma Delta. Each year in January, the payment of an annual per capita fee will reaffirm the member's support of the good works of the fraternity and continue the subscription to all issues of the official publication, DESMOS. A member residing at home or abroad paying an annual per capita fee through a Graduate Chapter will not be additionally responsible for an annual per capita fee.

Section 3. Allotted portions of life membership fees shall be kept in a special fund under the control of five (5) trustees appointed by the Supreme Council. These trustees shall serve for five years, until they resign or until they are removed by the Supreme Council. Money from the investment portfolio of the fund may be distributed for the current expenses at an annual level not to exceed five (5) percent of the market value of the fraternity's portfolio assets for the prior three (3) year period calculated on a quarterly basis. That percentage will be set annually by the Supreme Council.

24 CHAPTER VII

#### 25 Resignations

Any member in good standing may withdraw from active membership in the Supreme Chapter by tendering a written resignation to the Supreme Scribe.

#### CHAPTER VIII

# **Disciplinary Action**

Section 1. The Supreme Council has the right to exercise discipline over all members of the Fraternity. Any member or group of members may prefer charges against an offending member, and it shall be the duty of the Supreme Worthy Master to prepare such charges and present them to the Council as soon as practical. All charges shall be made in writing, specifying the character of the alleged offense and the time and place of its commission.

Section 2. If the Council deems the charges to be valid, the Supreme Grand Master shall order the Scribe to transmit a copy of them to the accused, and with the assent of the Council, appoint a Special Committee of Discipline consisting of a chairman and four (4) members. The Committee shall give a full, fair and impartial hearing to the accused and, upon completion, render its decision and recommend just punishment as it sees fit. If the accused is unable or refuses to attend, the hearing may be conducted in absentia.

The offenses of which the Council may take cognizance are:

- 1. Immoral or illegal conduct.
- 2. Acts that impair the good name of the Fraternity.
- 3. Violation of the obligation, the laws, rules, regulations and Principles of Ethics of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity.

Section 3. Witnesses who are members of the Fraternity shall give evidence at the hearing, after having been specially obligated. The testimony of absent members or other witnesses shall be received by affidavit. The accused, accuser, and members of the Committee, shall be entitled to propound such relevant questions as they may desire either in person or in writing as the Committee dictates. The chairman shall decide all issues as to the relevancy of questions and evidence. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Committee shall sequester itself and decide the case in private. The Committee shall first consider the guilt or innocence of the accused, voting separately by secret ballot upon each point made in the charge. The chairman and all members present shall be required to vote, a majority vote being necessary for conviction. If the accused is found guilty upon one or more points, the nature of the punishment shall next be decided by secret ballot. The punishment may be expulsion, suspension, a fine, or reprimand as the Committee may determine. It shall be the duty of the designated secretary to keep a full record of the hearing.

Section 4. A member who has been disciplined by a Special Committee of Discipline may appeal its decision by informing the Supreme Scribe of this intent not less than 60 days prior to the next meeting of the Supreme Council immediately following the disciplinary actions of the Committee. The Council shall first vote to ratify the Special Committee's decision as to the guilt or innocence of the accused, voting separately by secret ballot upon each point made in the charge, a majority ballot being necessary for ratification. If the accused is found guilty upon one or more points, the nature of the punishment shall next be considered by secret ballot, a majority again constituting ratification of the Special Committee's actions.

If, following appeal, the actions of the Special Committee of Discipline are not ratified, the Committee shall be obliged to amend its decisions accordingly, as the case may require.

CHAPTER XII

Each officer, Deputy, Representative, Committee Member, Employee and Agent of the Fraternity shall be held harmless and indemnified by the Fraternity against all claims and liabilities and all costs and expenses, including attorney's fees, reasonably incurred or imposed upon such person in connection with or resulting from any action suit or proceeding, or the settlement or comprise thereof, to which such person may be made a party by reason of any action taken or omitted to be taken by such person as an Officer, Deputy, Representative, Committee Member, Employee or Agent of the Fraternity in good faith. This right of Indemnification shall inure to such person whether or not such person is an Officer, Deputy, Representative, Committee Member, Employee or Agent at the time such liabilities, costs or expenses are imposed or incurred and, in the event of such person's death, shall extend to such person's legal representatives. To the extent available, the Fraternity shall insure against any potential liability hereunder.

CHAPTER XIII

#### Publications 24

Section 1. This Fraternity shall publish or cause to be published an official journal under the title of DESMOS of DELTA SIGMA DELTA, hereafter referred to as DESMOS.

- Section 2. The object of DESMOS shall be to report, chronicle and evaluate activities of members and chapters, scientific and professional activities of interest to the members and to keep an historical record of the Fraternity.
- Section 3. The frequency of issue of DESMOS shall be determined by the Supreme Council.
- Section 4. A portion of the life membership payment (\$30.00) shall be designated for the support of providing DESMOS to all active members.
  - Section 5. The Supreme Historian shall serve as Editor of DESMOS.

# **BYLAWS OF SUPREME COUNCIL** 1 **CHAPTER I** Meetings 3 Meetings of the Supreme Council shall be held at the call of the Supreme Grand 4 Master or at the written request of not less than five members of the Supreme Council. 5 Five or more members shall constitute a quorum. **CHAPTER II** 7 **Duties** 8 The Supreme Council, in order to relieve the Supreme Chapter of burdensome detail in connection with the management of the affairs of the Fraternity, shall have general 10 control of the business of the Fraternity. 11 It shall supervise the expenditure of all fraternity funds in accordance with the 12 budget, and if special needs arise not covered by the adopted budget, and authorize the 13 employment of a certified public accountant to prepare an annual financial statement of 14 the funds and other property, and the financial condition of the Fraternity. 15 It may authorize certain officers or committees to expend money for specific 16 purposes. In case a grave national emergency prevents holding a Called Meeting, the 17 Supreme Council shall elect all officers of the Supreme Chapter. 18 The Supreme Council shall receive Committee reports and resolutions, evaluate and 19 present to the Supreme Chapter, with its recommendation. It shall have the privilege of 20 introducing resolutions for the betterment of the Fraternity. 2.1 It shall be empowered to enter into and terminate agreements with contracted agents 22 and personnel involved in furthering the objectives and purposes of the Fraternity. 23 **CHAPTER III** 24 In case a vacancy occurs in any elective office except that of Supreme Grand 25 Master, the Council shall elect a new officer to complete the unexpired term. It shall

endorse the appointment of all standing committees, Deputy Supreme Grand Masters, Assistant Deputy Supreme Grand Masters, Personal Representatives, and Alternate Representatives of the Supreme Grand Master. It shall pass upon the reports of all standing committees except the Memorial Services Committee.

# Depositories

No trust company or bank shall qualify as depository of fraternity funds, nor any surety company qualify on the bonds of the Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer and Administrative Assistant without first being approved by the Supreme Council.

Any of the provisions of these Constitutions and Bylaws may be altered, modified or annulled by amendment. The exclusive power to make such amendments shall be vested in the Supreme Chapter. Every proposed amendment, or an abbreviated form of the proposed amendment showing the purpose and intent of the proposal shall be submitted in writing to the Supreme Chapter at a regular called meeting, or to the Supreme Scribe on or before May 1st the following year. All such proposed amendments shall be published and circulated to the membership at least 30 days prior to the next regularly Called Meeting of the Supreme Chapter. A vote on all proposals shall be taken at said meeting following publication.

#### CHAPTER VIII

# **Disciplinary Action**

Section 1. Each Chapter has the right to exercise discipline over its members. Any member or group of members may prefer charges against an offending member, and it shall be the duty of the Worthy Master to prepare the charges and prosecute the case as soon as practical.

Section 2. The offenses of which the chapter may take cognizance, to which it shall give full, fair and impartial trial, and upon conviction shall administer just punishment, are:

- 1. Immoral or illegal conduct.
- 2. Acts that impair the good name of the Fraternity.
- 3. Violation of the obligation, the laws, rules, regulations and Principles of Ethics of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity.

All charges shall be made in writing, specifying the character of the alleged offense and the time and place of its commission. Upon the reception of charges, the Grand Master shall order the Scribe to transmit a copy of them to the accused and to notify all members of the time and place of the trial.

Section 3. Witnesses who are members of this Fraternity shall give evidence at the trial, after having been specially obligated. The testimony of absent members or other witnesses shall be received by a special committee or by affidavit. The accused and accuser shall be entitled to be present and to propound such relevant questions as they may desire. If the accused is unable or refuses to attend, the trial may be conducted in absentia.

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Section 4. Following the verification of a quorum, the Grand Master, or his duly constituted representative, shall act as judge and shall decide all questions as to the relevancy of questions and evidence. At the conclusion of the evidence, the accused, if present, shall retire from the room and the Chapter shall decide the case. The Chapter shall first consider the guilt or innocence of the accused, voting separately by secret ballot upon each point made in the charge. All members present shall be required to vote, a majority vote being necessary for conviction; if the accused is found guilty upon one or more points, the nature of the punishment shall be decided by secret ballot. The punishment may be expulsion from the chapter, suspension, a fine or reprimand, as the Chapter may determine. It shall be the duty of the Scribe to keep full record of the trial.

Section 5. Expulsion from a Graduate Chapter shall not be construed to constitute expulsion from the Supreme Chapter of Delta Sigma Delta. However, the Chapter may prefer charges and recommend disciplinary action against a member as outlined in Chapter VIII of the Bylaws of the Supreme Chapter.

CHAPTER IX

Fiscal Year

Section 1. The fiscal year of each Graduate Chapter shall be fixed as of January 1 to December 31.

Section 2. Members shall be billed January 1<sup>st</sup> for local dues including per capita fee applicable. Those not having paid by December 31<sup>st</sup> shall automatically be dropped from Graduate Chapter membership unless the chapter elects to pay the per capita fee for them.

# **Reports and Payment of Per Capita Fees**

Section 1. Failure to remit payment of annual per capita fees by February 15<sup>th</sup> shall automatically deprive the Representative of that chapter from receiving the usual travel and per diem refund for that year, unless the Supreme Scribe recommends otherwise to the Supreme Council.

CHAPTER X
Fees and Dues

Section 1. The fee for initiation into an Undergraduate Chapter shall be determined annually by the Deputy Supreme Grand Master of the Chapter.

Section 2. Each initiate into an Undergraduate Chapter shall be required to pay an initiation fee to the Supreme Chapter; such fee would not apply to the Life Membership fee. This fee shall be determined by the Supreme Council and paid in addition to the Life Membership fee. Both fees to be transmitted to the Supreme Scribe within twenty (20) days after initiation.

Section 3. Each initiate shall pay to the initiating chapter, a life membership fee determined by the Supreme Council, which if not paid in full at the time of initiation, shall be prorated, collected by the Chapter and remitted to the Supreme Scribe in the following minimum installments:

In the event at any time an initiate pays an installment of the life membership fee in an amount greater than the next installment the Chapter is required to remit to the Supreme Scribe, such excess payment received by the Chapter shall be forwarded together with the next required remittance.

Failure of an initiate to pay any installment of the life membership fee within such time as to permit the initiating Chapter to make remittance to the Supreme Scribe in accordance with the above schedule, may be considered evidence of failure of the initiate to consummate life membership.

In the event that the membership of an undergraduate in the local chapter is terminated for any reason, only those pre-paid life membership installments for any year subsequent to the year of termination may be refunded to the undergraduate chapter.

Section 4. An annual per capita fee to the Supreme Chapter is to be determined annually by the Supreme Council. Fees shall be paid to the Supreme Scribe from the Chapter treasury on or before January 20th, for each member of record as of November 1<sup>st</sup> of the preceding year.

Section 5. The amount of all dues of Undergraduate Chapter members shall be approved by the Deputy Supreme Grand Master.

**CHAPTER XI** 1 **Fines and Penalties** 2 Section 1. Any member unable to furnish a satisfactory excuse for absence from 3 Chapter meetings shall be penalized by a majority vote of the Chapter. The penalty for 4 each offense shall not be less than fifty cents (\$.50) or more than one month's dues to the 5 Chapter. 6 Section 2. No member shall be entitled to vote while dues, life membership fees, or 7 penalties remain unpaid for a period of sixty (60) days after billing. Any member in arrears shall surrender the insignia of the fraternity upon the request of the Deputy 9 Supreme Grand Master until he is again in good standing with the Fraternity. 10 Section 3. Any member who has resigned, been suspended or dropped for any cause, 11 and who wishes to reinstate membership shall pay through the local chapter to the 12 Supreme Chapter a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for such reinstatement. This fee shall not be 13 credited to the member's life membership account. 14 Section 4. Any undergraduate member who shall resign, be suspended or dropped for 15 any cause by a Chapter for a second time, shall be declared "expelled" and forever barred 16 from reinstatement in Delta Sigma Delta, except upon an unanimous vote of approval for 17 reinstatement by the Supreme Council. 18 Section 5. Any member resigned, suspended, or dropped for any cause by the 19 Chapter while in school, and who seeks reinstatement after graduation must: 20 1. Have the approval of the Deputy Supreme Grand Master of the Chapter 21 from which he or she resigned, was suspended or dropped. 22 2. Be free from all financial obligation to the Chapter. 23 3. Pay twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to the Supreme Chapter in addition to the 24 regular fee for life membership. 25

Section 6. Any undergraduate chapter member who fails to complete life

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1 CHAPTER XII

# **Disciplinary Action**

Section 1. Any member or group of members may prefer charges against an offending member. It shall be the duty of the Worthy Master to prepare the charges and prosecute the case as soon as practical.

Section 2. The offenses of which the chapter may take cognizance, to which it shall give full, fair and impartial trial, and upon conviction shall administer just punishment, are:

- 1. Immoral or illegal conduct.
- 2. Acts that impair the good name of the Fraternity.
- 3. Scholastic failure, unless the reason is approved by the Deputy.
  - 4. Violation of the obligation, the laws, rules, regulations and Principles of Ethics of Delta Sigma Delta Fraternity.

All charges shall be made in writing, specifying the character of the alleged offense and the time and place of its commission. Upon the reception of charges, the Grand Master shall order the Scribe to transmit a copy of them to the accused and to notify all members of the time and place of the trial.

Section 3. Witnesses who are members of this Fraternity shall give evidence at the trial, after having been specially obligated. The testimony of absent members or other witnesses shall be received by a special committee or by affidavit. The accused and accuser shall be entitled to be present and to propound such relevant questions as they may desire.

Section 4. Following the verification of a quorum, the Grand Master, in person or by representative appointed by the Deputy Supreme Grand Master of the chapter, shall act as judge and decide all questions as to the relevancy of evidence. At the conclusion of the evidence, the accused shall retire from the room, and the Chapter shall consider first the guilt or innocence of the accused, voting by secret ballot upon each point made in the charge. All members present shall be required to ballot, a two-thirds (2/3) vote being necessary for conviction. If the accused is found guilty upon one or more points, the nature of the punishment shall be decided by secret ballot. The punishment may be expulsion, suspension, a fine or reprimand, as the Chapter may decide. It shall be the duty of the Scribe to keep full record of the trial. Any member convicted of an offense in an Undergraduate Chapter may appeal to the Supreme Council for a final decision, provided that notice is sent to the Supreme Council at least sixty (60) prior to its next regular meeting.

# CHAPTER XV

### **Parliamentary Procedure**

The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order*, Latest Edition, shall govern the Undergraduate Chapter in all cases to which they apply and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws.

### CHAPTER XVI

### 7 Amendments

Any of the provisions of these Constitutions and Bylaws may be altered, modified or annulled by amendment. The exclusive power to make such amendments shall be vested in the Supreme Chapter. Every proposed amendment, or an abbreviated form of the proposed amendment showing the purpose and intent of the proposal shall be submitted in writing to the Supreme Chapter at a regular called meeting or to the Supreme Scribe on or before May 1st of the following year. All such proposed amendments shall be published in the Summer issue of DESMOS. A vote on all proposals shall be taken at the next regular called meeting of the Supreme Chapter following publication.

Adoption shall be a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the members present and voting. Amendments approved shall take effect at once, unless a specified time is included in the amendment.

If the said proposed amendment received an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present at the meeting and voting, it shall thereupon become an amendment to, and a part of, these Bylaws.

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During the time of suspension the Deputy shall demand the Fraternity insignia from the suspended member. The Deputy shall immediately report the suspension, with reasons, to the Supreme Grand Master, who may report it to the Supreme Council with recommendations; or if so desired, may deal with the matter locally. Members dropped from the Chapter for financial reasons and those dropped from school for scholastic reasons should be reported to the Supreme Scribe by the Deputy Supreme Grand Master. The deputy should request the return of pre-paid Life Membership installments for any year subsequent to the year of termination of membership.
